Respected Sir,

Presently we are in distress and the opportunity provided by you to put forward our grievances to you in person is like a soothing balm.

The problems we are facing are innumerable and our existence in this Cable TV industry will become short lived because of the existing rules and regulations. We need your kind consideration and immediate action to overcome the problems.

Sir, as you know we are the pioneers of this Cable TV industry and our enterpreunership two decades back has made this industry this 'BIG'. We have invested and reinvested our hard earned money in creating this industry. Livelihood of us and our employees are in a precarious situation. Infact we are in ICCU state and we need your care and prescription in the form of amendments of existing rules and regulations. Only your intervention to amend the rules and regulations will protect the welfare of thousands of LCO's and lakhs of our employees. The following points need your urgent attention.

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:: 2 ::

In 2009 when CAS system was introduced in the Metro Cities we were given Rs. 82 (excluding taxes) and 5 years later we are being asked to take just 45% of Rs. 100 of BST as our revenue. This revenue share defies every logic. We hereby request you to provide Rs. 100/- of BST to LCO's to protect the welfare of LCO's and employees and also our fundamental right to live. When more than 90% of investment in the form of laying cables and installing groundnetwork equipment is borne by the LCO's how this 45% revenue shared is worked upon is wondering.

Please ensure that the STB's provided to us by MSO's to be as per the specifications of BIS. Universal STB's just like a mobile phone where in a subscribers STB is agreeable to all MSO's signals should be made mandatory.

There have been instances where the licences of MSO's have been cancelled and the LCO's having very difficult times with their subscribers needing replacement of STB's. Kindly provide the needed protection and guarantee in this kind of situations.

The ownership of STB's bought by subscribers paying money needs clarity. MSO's cannot claim ownership of the STB's after receiving money for the said item. Ownership by MSO's can be claimed only when STB's are given free of cost to a subscriber.

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:: 3 ::

We request you to treat Hyderabad as Phase 3 for DAS implementation instead of phase 2 because

- (a) Currently only 25% of DAS notified area is under phase 2 and the remaining 75% In phase 3 implementation.
- (b) There are several cases pending in court regarding the same.

We request you to ensure that there is no differential pricing for the pay channels between national MSO's like DEN, HATHWAY, SITI CABLE and independent small MSO's.

The MSO's and their distributors are harassing LCO's by engaging in Illegal and unfair practices. The MSO's have forced LCO's to sign DAS agreement without even giving time to go through and the copy of the signed agreement has never been handed over to LCO's.

Interconnect agreements between MSO's and LCO's need a thorough remake as the present agreements are totally one sided favouring only the MSO's.

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:: 4 ::

intention to digitalise and create commendable but the process called upon by rules and regulations are not complimentary. Infact digitalization is being thrusted down the throats of LCO's and subscribers. We hereby request you to postpone digitalization to create an organized Cable TV ecosystem. Also please make analogue systems mandatory for the all MSO's till the digitalization system comes in
